

February

- Receive an invite for date/time of scheduling conference via USPS mail
- <u>Scheduling Conferences</u>: February 6th February 12th
- 8th grade students & their parents will meet with HS Counselor at the Middle School to discuss course selections.

June

- Students receive their 2024-2025 class schedule on <u>MOVE UP DAY - Friday, June 7th</u>
- 8th grade students visit the high school to follow their schedule for upcoming year.

Advanced Placement Program

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program provides motivated students the opportunity to pursue college-level studies while still in HS.

AP students take an end-of-course exam in May to demonstrate college level proficiency and potentially earn college credits.


